
EVERGREENS**(Bundles of 25 = \$16.50)**

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*) 10-18"

Fastest growing spruce. Short-needed tree with deep green color. Good Christmas tree, ornamental and reforestation use.

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea Pungens glauca*) 9-15"

One of the finest trees for Christmas tree, ornamental and windbreak use. Color ranges from blue-green to silvery blue. Our seedlings are grown from the very finest seed collection areas available. This provides you with superb color, excellent shape and a good growth rate.

White Spruce (*Picea glauca*) 10-18"

Very hardy, compact tree with short blue-green needles. Fast rate of growth for Christmas trees, ornamentals and windbreaks. Tolerates wide variety of soils.

White Pine (*Pinus strobus*) 6-12"

Soft blue-green needles 3-5" long. Fast growth with excellent needle retention. Desirable for Christmas trees, ornamentals, and reforestation.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziessi glauca*) 10-18"

Excellent demand as a Christmas tree or an ornamental. Extremely fast growth, superb needle retention and soft, 1" blue-green needles make Douglas the favorite tree for many growers. Prefers fertile, well-drained, light soil with full sun.

Scotch Pine (*Pinus sylvestris*) 10-16"

A favorite Christmas tree of retailers and wholesalers. It has a blue-green color and produces beautiful uniformly dense trees. Excellent needle retention, and will grow on a wide variety of soils.

Austrian Pine (*Pinus nigra*) 10-16"

Beautiful dark green, long-needed Christmas, ornamental and windbreak tree. Extremely hardy plant tolerates poor soils, dry soils and air pollution.

TREES AND FLOWERING SHRUBS

NEW

Honeylocust, Thornless (*Gleditsia triacanthos var. inermis*) \$2.50 12-36"

Grows to 100 feet. Fine textured leaves. Grows well in any type of soil. A superb tree for withstanding city conditions. This tree is tolerant of roadway salt. A small percentage may have thorns. Very popular as a shade tree because leaves are so fine. They break up as they drop in the fall, thus eliminating leaf raking.

White Dogwood (*Cornus florida*) \$3.00 ea. 36-48"

One of the most popular of native flowering trees. In early Spring it is covered with white-petaled flowers; in early Fall with red berries and beautiful crimson leaves.

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*) \$2.50ea. 24-30"

A Native of North America. Fast growing. Heights can reach 90 feet. Can live up to 500 years. Bark is dark reddish grey brown. Leaves are green in summer and a rich brownish red in fall. The acorns make good wildlife food.

Sugar Maple (*Acer sacharum*) \$2.50 ea. 18-24"

Height 60 to 75 feet. Spread 45 to 50 feet. Mature trees provide sugar products from sap in the spring. Brilliant yellow, burnt orange and limited red tones in autumn. A good timber tree. Does not do well in wet areas or in small compact restricted growing areas. Native to northeastern United States.

Serviceberry, (*Amelanchier alnifolia*) \$2.50 ea. 12-24"

Also called Juneberry. A small tree or large shrub up to 13 feet high. In early spring it has lacy white blooms and in autumn blazing color on rounded leaves. In the late spring the fruit can be eaten, as purple-red berries ripen.

NEW

Willow, Dappled (*Salix integra*) \$3.00 12-15"

Height and spread reach 3 to 5 feet. Its main attraction is the tri-color leaves of white, green and pink. We advise periodic trimming to maintain leaf variegation. Tolerates wet conditions. Leaf color stays better in full sun.

Lynwood Gold Forsythia (*Forsythia x intermedia 'Lynwood Gold'*) \$2.50 18-24"

Very fast, upright growth to 7 feet; spread of 5 feet. One of the best plants for fast flowering screen. Deep golden flowers, early spring, more thickly and evenly distributed along the stems than other Forsythia. Ordinary to poor soil. Plant in full sun. Can withstand adverse city conditions. This plant can easily be pruned, after blooming, to maintain desired height and will bloom better next year. For hedge, plant 4 feet apart.

NEW

Winterberry Holly (*Ilex verticillate*) \$2.00 6-12"

Height and spread 6 to 12 feet. One of the best deciduous plants for fall and winter color. Female plants produce bright red berries in profusion in early fall while leaves are still green and remain until mid-winter after leaf drop. Late fall foliage color is yellow. Likes acid soil. Will tolerate wet, swampy conditions. Native to Northeastern United States. As these plants are grown from seed, we cannot distinguish between male and female plants. Therefore, you should plant at least 5 to ensure pollination. Very good shrub as a screen or background. Attracts winter song birds.

Purple Lilac \$3.00 ea. 24-36"

This common lilac cultivar is an upright, deciduous shrub which grows 8-15' tall. Deep purple to wine red, sweetly fragrant, single flowers with white edges. Excellent fresh cut flower.
